Introduction of Speakers



Dr. Don. A. Carson

Dr. Carson is a world-renowned professor of New Testament at [Trinity Evangelical Divinity School](#) at Deerfield, IL USA. Dr. Carson received a BS degree in Chemistry from McGill University, a M. Div. from Central Baptist Seminary in Toronto, and a Ph.D. in New Testament from Cambridge University. Before going to Trinity, Dr. Carson taught at Northwest Baptist Theological Seminary in Canada, where he served for two years as academic dean.

Dr. Carson's areas of expertise include biblical theology, the historical Jesus, postmodernism, pluralism, Greek grammar, Johannine theology, Pauline theology, and questions of suffering and evil. He is a member of the Tyndale Fellowship For Biblical Research, the Society of Biblical Literature, the Evangelical Theological Society, the Canadian Society of Biblical Studies, and the Institute For Biblical Research.

Dr. Carson has written or edited more than 45 books. He was the founding chair of the GRAMCORD Institute, a research and educational institution designed to develop and promote computer-related tools for research into the Bible, focusing especially on the original languages. Dr. Carson is an active guest lecturer in academic and church settings around the world.



Rev. Jamie Hudson Taylor IV

Rev. Jamie Taylor is the great-great grandson of J. Hudson Taylor, founder of [China Inland Mission](#) (now OMF International).

After attending elementary school and high school (Morrison Academy) in Taiwan, Jamie returned to the US for studies at Seattle Pacific University and Asbury Theological Seminary. Jamie served on the pastoral staff of Chinese Bible Church of Greater Boston for 5 years, and with Campus Evangelical Fellowship in Taiwan for 3 years. In 1996, Jamie and his family moved to Hong Kong to serve with the Chinese Ministries Field of OMF International, first as Director for Personnel, and later as the Field Director.

Jamie's wife, Mimi, studied at the Soochow University in Taipei majoring in voice. She then took graduate studies at Boston University in voice performance. Mimi has taught at China Evangelical Seminary, Taiwan Presbyterian Seminary, Yu Shan Seminary, and Hualien Normal University. Mimi has produced 3 CDs in Taiwanese and Mandarin. Jamie and Mimi have three children - James Hudson Taylor V, Selina Amelia Taylor, and Joy Leone Taylor.



Brother Samuel Lamb

China house church preacher. Borne on 10/4/24 in Macau. Brother Lamb was arrested in 1955 for his faith in Christ. Released from prison in 1978, he returned to Guangzhou and built a church in Da-Ma-Zhan. During the period of 1979 to 2000, Brother Lamb and his co-workers baptized 5000 new believers. He authored the 'spiritual word' book series, which has served as a spiritual resource for house churches. The theme of Brother Lamb's talk at the 2007 Conference is "Only know Jesus Christ and Him Crucified".



Brother Joseph Li

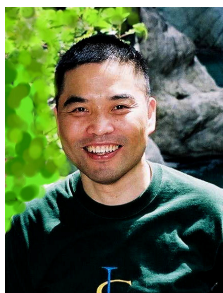
Brother Li graduated from Hangzhou Seminary in 1950. He has served the Lord for more than half a Century in Mainland China, and is a historical witness of the church revival in China. He was imprisoned four times for the Gospel during his life. In his second arrest in June 1973, he was given the death sentence for preaching during the Cultural Revolution. However, the almighty God miraculously saved him from the Lion's mouth, so that he can continue to serve various churches in China till today. His writings and testimonies were published in issues 19, 20, 21, 22, and 25 of [Christian Life Quarterly](#). His writings, such as 'Key For Climbing The Mountain' and 'Morning Light', are treasured by Chinese Christians around the globe.



Rev. Jonathan Chiu

Rev. Chiu was borne in Xiamen, China and grew up in Taiwan. After graduating from Taiwan National University with a degree in Chemical Engineering, Rev. Chiu offered himself to the Lord. From 1966-1989, he served as a co-worker with Campus Crusade, and from 1979-1989, also served as the pastor of Taipei Bible Baptist Tabernacle Church. Rev. Chiu then went to the US and served as the pastor of Atlanta Chinese Christian Church till 2002. He is now the Executive Director of Care Ministries International.

For many years, Rev. Chiu has served in evangelical ministries, including pastoring, teaching, and training. Mrs. Chiu serves in areas of Christian music, and also promotes women and prayer ministries. They have three grown-up daughters. The second daughter is serving the Lord full time, including serving as a missionary in Golden Triangle.



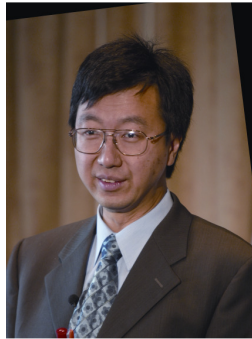
Rev. Paul Kong

Borne in Taiwan in 1949. Rev. Kong obtained his Ph.D. in Theology from Vanderbilt University in 1989, and then served as Academic Dean of China Evangelical Seminary till 1995. He is currently the pastor of Hsin-Yi Friendship Presbyterian Church in Taipei. Rev. Kong is the author or co-author of numerous books which can be found on www.kword.org



Dr. Kai-yum Cheung Teng

Dr. Teng obtained her M.A. in Mission and D.Min. in Missiology from [Trinity Evangelical Divinity School](#). She was the Executive Director of Hong Kong Christian Short Term Mission Training Centre, President of Christian Ministry Institute, and founder of [International Fellowship of Christian Short-term Missions](#). She is currently a missionary partner of US Alliance Mission, and Assistant Professor of Cross-Cultural Studies at the Alliance Bible Seminary. She is also a volunteer minister of North Point Alliance Church and a Board member of [Christian Life Press](#).



Rev. Stephen Chan

Rev. Chan was borne in Taiwan and moved to Hong Kong at the age of 10. He accepted Christ in 1975 and offered himself to the Lord in 1979. After receiving seminary training at the Hong Kong Chinese University (Chung Chi College) Divinity School, Rev. Chan went to the US in 1989 and obtained a Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Chicago Divinity School. Rev. Chan is now an Associate Professor of Theology at the University of Seattle, and also serves as the pastor of Bay Area Reformed Evangelical Church, Academic Dean of Reformed Institute, and member of the Editorial Board of [Christian Life Quarterly](#). Rev. Chan has published numerous theological articles and translated several Christian theology books.



Rev. Yujian Hong

Rev. Hong comes from Shanghai. In 1991, he obtained a Ph.D. in physical chemistry from the University of Pennsylvania. He also accepted Christ the same year, and in 1992 entered Regent College to receive seminary training. He currently serves as the pastor of Faith Chinese North American Baptist Church in Vancouver, and a member of the Editorial Board of ['Christian Life Quarterly'](#) and ['Life and Faith'](#).



Rev. Pine Wang

Borne in Henan, China, Rev. Wang received Jesus Christ in 1990, and came to the US in 1991 to receive seminary training, first at [Moody Bible Institute](#), and then at [Trinity Evangelical Divinity School](#). At the end of 1996, Rev. Wang and his wife, Esther, founded [Christian Life Press](#). He is currently the Editor-in-Chief of ['Christian Life Quarterly'](#) and ['Life and Faith'](#). Rev. Wang has focused on 'Jesus Christ and Him Crucified' as the main theme in the various meetings he led, emphasizing the importance of recognizing and repenting our sins, and living a purified and sacrificial disciple life.
